North Main Street Improvements

You asked, so Matt Vinter from the City of Rockford Engineering Division visited our May association meeting to give us an update and answer questions about this major improvement project to the North Main Street corridor.

Some things to know:

The project is a joint effort between the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and the City of Rockford. North Main Street is a significant transportation corridor through Rockford that provides access to numerous neighborhoods, employment centers, and recreational facilities. Due to its vital role in the area's overall transportation system, the project was included in the State of Illinois' Illinois Jobs Now! Capital Construction Plan.

The project will result in the corridor being fully reconstructed as a modern State Highway with a four-lane concrete pavement cross section, concrete medians, major intersection improvements, upgraded turn lanes, and new drainage facilities from Yonge Street to Benington Road.

The City requested that corridor street lighting, ornamental traffic signals, a shared-use path, sidewalks, upgraded water infrastructure, and landscaping elements (including some grass medians and decorative stamped concrete) be incorporated into the project. The City will be taking the lead on pre-construction property demolition projects.

Preliminary utility work is planned to begin this summer, as Com Ed begins to relocate their lines in preparation for the overall project.

The entire project is planned to be complete in late 2017.

It's important to know that the city will monitor access to local businesses and will oversee water main work, pathways, and lighting systems, as they did with the roundabout constructions, which was completed on time, on schedule, and on budget!



Top 10 Ways to Enjoy Living in Edgewater

Whether you're new to the neighborhood or have lived here for years, you might have some questions about living in Edgewater, so we're answering some of them here for you.



1. Start with your alderman.

We are extremely fortunate to have a very responsive alderman, John Beck, who also happens to be our association president. If you have a city, street, property or neighborhood standard concern, start by contacting him. He has graciously offered to contact the appropriate party to ensure that concerns are heard.

FYI, we live in Rockford's 12th Ward. John is serving his fourth term on the city council and his ward constitutes an area much larger than our neighborhood, which is where he resides.

2. Check us out on social media.

Join NextDoor Edgewater, our private social network for you, your neighbors and your community. It's a great way to communicate and ask questions, post items for sale, post about lost and found pets, etc. Like us on Facebook: Edgewater Neighborhood Association, and visit our website at www.rockfordedgewater.org. All three are great resources to get updates, view monthly meeting minutes, and connect with your neighbors.

3. Talk to your neighbors.

If you don't know each other already, introduce yourself. Let them know a little bit about you; find out how long they've lived in the neighborhood and if they are association members. In the future, if you have a concern, talk to them politely about it before you escalate an issue. For instance, if you're wondering about the car parked in front of their house that doesn't seem to move, ask about it before you jump to conclusions. Chances are you'd like it if someone extended you the same benefit of the doubt.

4. Pick up after yourself (and your dog)!

It's common courtesy and makes our neighborhood a more pleasant place to live, and walk. As you walk your dog, try to have your pup use the right of way between the sidewalk and the street and also, avoid ornamental plantings, flowers and tender shrubbery.

5. If in doubt, CALL.

If you have a medical, safety, or criminal emergency, call 911. If you have a non-emergency concern, call 815.966-2900.
