Clinton Street Block Party

Echos on Clinton Street

Edgewater's homes, many nearing a century old, have sheltered generations of Rockfordians—each leaving behind subtle marks on the walls, gardens, and porches they once called their own.

Spend enough time in Edgewater, and echoes of the past begin to repeat themselves. This year's Clinton Street Block Party is the latest example.

Nearly two decades ago, Chuck and Nancy Regan lived in the little white Barloga house in the middle of the 2000 block of Clinton Street. Each summer, they invited neighbors to a block party: barricades went up on Cottage Grove and Harper, tables and chairs were borrowed from Chuck's church, and neighbors reconnected after long winters spent hibernating indoors.

When Chuck and Nancy retired to North Carolina, the spark that lit those beloved summer gatherings quietly flickered out. A few years later, a new family moved into that same white house. The Pikes brought a youthful energy to the block, and after much encouragement from their neighbors, committed to revive the tradition. Their enthusiasm proved contagious. The following year, what began as a single-block gathering expanded to include an adjacent block with Kimberly Schmitt. Then the next block with Lesli Nelson Richter. The year after that, it grew even further.

In 2025, block captains of Clinton Street, Clinton Road, and Clinton Boulevard organized a block-by-block blowout that took over the boulevard. Inflatable water slides, brilliant games including the beloved egg toss challenge for block supremacy (congrats 2100 block!), ice cream sandwiches from local purveyor Bad Humor, brats and hot dogs from Edgewater's own Pinnon's Meats, and a bounty of potluck dishes fueled an evening of fun, laughter, and storytelling.

Neighbors, both longtime residents and new arrivals, came together in celebration of summer, community, and shared history. It was the kind of evening Chuck and Nancy would have cherished. That continuity is what makes life in Edgewater so special: we live in a place where the past and present meet, and where community winds its way from one generation to the next—evolving with the times, yet always grounded on the same bumpy brick road.



WHY MEMBERSHIP IS IMPORTANT



The Edgewater Neighborhood Association was established in 1979 to create a greater sense of community and provide resources that help keep Edgewater a beautiful, safe, and inviting place to live. Currently, 161 households have paid the membership fee for 2025.

2025 GOAL - 50% of the 870 Households as Members

YOUR ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP FEE SUPPORTS:

- Seasonal Neighborhood Activities including the Easter Egg Hunt, Annual Garage Sale, Luminaria and the holiday party.
- Snow Plow Fund: While the city says they will plow our neighborhood's alleys as time permits, we pool our resources to contract a plow service to keep the alleys clear in a timely manner. These fees are up an average of 7%. We spend \$410-\$585 per snowfall depending on inches of snow.
- Plantings at the signs and pots on the bridge.
- Postage and printing for neighborhood mailings as well as signs advertising neighborhood activities.
