City News and Notes

North Main Construction Update

On Monday March 20, 2017, the southbound lanes of North Main Street will be shut down for roadway milling and paving operations for the length of the project until further notice. Southbound and northbound traffic will be two lane, two way traffic with one lane in either direction for the duration of this work. Please note, businesses are open during construction.

On Wednesday March 22, 2017 a detour will be scheduled for North Main Street between Yonge Street north to Brown Avenue. All through traffic will be encouraged to utilize Huffman Blvd. The detour will be up for a maximum of 4 days ending on March 25, 2017.


We remind and encourage you to support businesses along North Main that are impacted by this construction project. Your patronage will help ensure that the North Main corridor has a variety of business offerings and that residents of Edgewater and the northwest side of Rockford have services and amenities close to home.

Street Sweeping & Yard Refuse Pickup

The Street Division will begin Spring Street Sweeping on arterial streets the week of March 20. This phase of the City's street sweeping operation will take approximately 2-3 weeks, weather permitting. Central Business District street sweeping will tentatively begin the week of March 27 during the overnight hours.

Spring residential street sweeping will begin after arterials are completed. The transition to residential streets is anticipated to be the week of April 10.

Yard refuse pickup began the week of March 13th, and occurs on the same day your trash is picked up. Refuse including leaves, grass, and sticks should be placed in compostable brown paper yard waste bags or in garbage cans that are clearly marked with an "X" on all sides. Branches may be no more than 4 inches in diameter, should be trimmed to 4 feet in length, no bundle of branches or yard waste bag or can should weigh more than 50 pounds. Reminder: Trash and yard refuse should not be placed in the street but up on the right of way or driveway so street sweepers can get closer to the curb. Sweeping crews do not come back to sweep an area that was missed because of improperly placed garbage receptacles or parked cars.



Potholes & Patching

Even though winter was relatively mild this year, the seasonal melting and thawing still does damage to our streets. Public works staff are patching holes citywide, both



proactively and by citizen request. See a pothole that needs fixing? Please report it to (779) 348-7260.

Storm Drains

Street sweepers will help clear winter debris from our streets, but you can help ensure our water system remains efficient and free from excessive yard waste and trash by taking an extra look at any storm drains in the street along your property. As spring rains begin, even partially blocked storm drains can cause major flooding problems. While you're out starting spring vard work take a moment to clear a storm drain!

Election Day is April 4!

The Consolidated Election is rapidly approaching, but voters still have plenty of time to make an informed decision before heading to the polls on April 4.

Early voting has begun; registered voters can visit the Rockford Board of Elections (301 S 6th St) through April 3; visit <u>VoteRockford.com</u> or call 815-987-5750 for open hours. On election day (April 4) you must vote at your polling place. Edgewater residents do not all have the same polling place. Check the map to the right or visit <u>VoteRockford.com</u> to determine your polling center:

#1 — Third Presbyterian Church, 1221 Custer Ave

#2 & #3 — Beth-Eden United Methodist Church, 3201 Huffman Blvd

Vote by Mail ballots may be requested up until 5 days prior to the election. Visit <u>VoteRockford.com</u> for full details.

Spring Creek Road Multi-Use Path Update


Last month the Rockford City Council approved \$100,000 for the design and analysis of the Spring Creek Road Multi-Use Path that will connect the Sinnissippi Path on the west with the Spring Brook on-street path to the east. The Spring Creek path had been identified in community plans for nearly 20 years. Last year, when details of a new construction project along Spring Creek Road involving the Rock River Water Reclamation District and the City of Rockford were revealed and did not include consideration of the long-laid plans for a path, the public spoke up. Over



1,300 citizens signed a petition in support of the Spring Creek Path and from that groundswell, the "I Bike Rockford" group was formed to advocate for plans like these and further the cycling culture in the community.

This path will fulfill a critical east/west connection for people who choose to travel without an automobile, for the 850 students at Eisenhower Middle School, neighborhood residents and many others. Furthermore, it ties residents west of the Rock River to locations east such as Rock Valley College, the Perryville Path and Rock Cut State Park through one simple and straightforward route. Construction of this path will show that Rockford continues to take the steps necessary to make it a top 25 city and is a powerful example of the value and strength of engaged citizen advocates.
