If you received this newsletter, you are a resident in the Edgewater Neighborhood. The boundaries for Edgewater are Auburn on the South, North Main on the West, the Rock River to the East, and the railroad tracks to the North. These boundaries are pictured in the map on the outside of this newsletter.



Edgewater includes approximately 1,200 households, both single family homes as well as multi-family dwellings, and every household is welcome to become a member of the Edgewater Neighborhood Association. The association has been active since 1979, and continues to organize neighborhood activities and advocate on behalf of Edgewater residents to this day. Membership is voluntary, \$20 per year per household.

Your membership helps support neighborhood activities (such as the Easter Egg Hunt, 4th of July, Luminaria, and the Holiday Party) and your additional donations provide funds to pay for alley snowplowing — the City of Rockford does not plow alleys, so Edgewater pools our resources to pay as a whole neighborhood for that service.

In the past couple of years, we have worked to increase engagement and camaraderie among neighbors. We developed a new website, increased communication through social media, and changed the annual holiday party format to be more welcoming to families and neighbors from all corners of Edgewater. We feel that these efforts have been successful! However, over the years membership in the Edgewater Neighborhood Association has decreased. This, combined with a hard winter last year that drained our snow plow fund, mean that finances are not as strong as we would like them to be. You can see a breakdown of the Association revenue and expense from 2019 on page 3.

We believe that Edgewater is a stronger and more vibrant neighborhood because of the work of our neighborhood association. For the Association to remain strong, we depend on your membership! As we approach our annual Membership Drive (learn more on page 2) we encourage you to renew your membership for 2020 or sign up for the first time. Thank you in advance for helping ensure the Association can continue working to keep Edgewater a place we can feel proud to call home.

We hope you enjoy the wealth of information and updates included in this newsletter, and that you'll extend your thanks and patronage to the businesses and organizations which have advertised within!

News from the Neighborhood Association

Edgewater Neighborhood Association: Profit and Loss for 2019

To the right you will find a profit and loss statement for the Association, detailing income and expense incurred from November 2018 to November 2019.

A couple of key points to note:

- 1. Snowplow expense for Winter 2018 2019 exceeded snowplow donations during the same timeframe. Remember, the City of Rockford does not plow Edgewater's alleys, so as a neighborhood we pool our resources to pay for the entire neighborhood's alleys to be plowed. The prior two year's lighter winters had built up a reserve that covered the deficit in 2018 - 2019, but we need to build the fund back up to ensure we have the resources to plow Edgewater's alleys throughout the winter of 2019 - 2020.
- Each Special Event does make some income, but that income does not cover the cost of the events. Membership Dues cover the difference for each event. The Holiday Party is the most expensive event Edgewater puts on. Three years ago the format of that event was changed to be more welcoming to families and neighbors from all corners of Edgewater. This effort has been a great success, with attendance exceeding 130 people in 2018 and much greater diversity of Edgewater residents represented. In order to keep offering this lively, welcoming event we will need to increase Membership Dues to cover the difference between income and expense.

While Edgewater Neighborhood Association still has a positive balance in our bank account, we know that without increasing the number of households that participate in Membership and donate to the Snow Plow Fund it will become increasingly difficult to offer the events, activities, and advocacy that have been offered in the past.

Whether you've been a Member since 1979 (when the Association was founded!), were once a Member and have let your membership lapse, or have never chosen to become a member, we ask that you join us in Membership for 2020! There are lots of ways to become a Member:


Grace Funeral & Cremation Services opens new facility

Consider the Rockford Family Dental Membership Plan in 2020!

Dr. Baer-Mirza and Dr. Mirza created the Rockford Family Dental Membership Plan to help patients in their office that did not have insurance. The plan offers reduced fees on all dental procedures at their office located at 2715 N. Main Street.

Starting January 1st, 2020 the plan will offer more benefits to loyal members. The Plan will cost \$10.00 per month per member and runs from January 1st to December 31st, 2020. The membership fee includes 1 Exam, 6 intraoral radiographs and 2 adult/child healthy mouth cleanings per year. Each member will receive a member packet which will include the member plan fee schedule, a membership card and an explanation on how the plan works.

The fee schedule included in the member packet describes the reduced fees offered at Rockford Family Dental's office at 2715 N. Main Street. Members receive between 20% - 45% reduction from regular fees. There is no annual maximum and no annual deductible. There is an additional 5% discount if the balance for dental services is paid in full by cash or check the same day as the service is received.

There are two ways to pay for 2020 Membership:

- 1. Onetime payment of \$120.00 in January 2020; or
- 2. Two payments of \$70 in the consecutive months of January 2020 and February 2020.

Seasonal Reminders



Yard Refuse Pickup

Yard refuse pickup will continue through the week of December 2nd, and occurs on the same day your trash is picked up. Refuse including leaves, grass, and sticks should be placed in compostable brown paper yard waste bags or in garbage cans that are clearly marked with an "X" on all sides. Branches may be no more than 4 inches in diameter, should be trimmed to 4 feet in



length, no bundle of branches or yard waste bag or can should weigh more than 50 pounds. Reminder: Bagged trash and yard refuse should not be placed in the street for pickup but up on the right of way or driveway so street sweepers can get closer to the curb. Sweeping crews do not come back to sweep an area that was missed because of improperly placed garbage receptacles or parked cars.

Reminder: it is illegal to blow, rake, or sweep yard refuse into the street. This is not only unsightly but also clogs gutters, storm drains, and puts unnecessary debris into our water system.

Cold Mornings = Seasonal Opportunity for Car Theft

Every year when the temperature drops, it can be very tempting to leave your car running and unattended, to warm up before the drive to work, school, or errands. This leads to another sort of temptation, for enterprising thieves watching for empty, running cars! This year the Rockford Police Department released a funny meme to raise awareness about this serious problem. Never



leave your car running and unattended, even for a few minutes. The cold isn't pleasant but having your car stolen is WAY more unpleasant!




Seasonal Reminders



Help Keep Edgewater Walkable All Year: Keep Sidewalks Clear!

As long as the snow flies, please keep sidewalks as clear of snow and ice as possible. If you live on a corner, do your best to keep the path from the sidewalk to the street clear; this is not always an easy task but your efforts ensure pedestrians and pups have safe passage year round.



Winter Walking When take Extra Care! When you're out there enjoying Luminaria or any other sparkling winter night, take EXTRA care to avoid falls and injuries if snow and ice are a factor. Remember the penguin and their careful, tottering steps — it may feel a little silly but remember, safety first!

Winter Parking & Snow Clearing Reminders

Odd/Even parking is always in effect always during a declared Snow Emergency to assist with snow clearing operations. Vehicles must be parked on the side of the street with odd-numbered addresses on odd-numbered davs and on with even-numbered addresses even-numbered days by 8:00am (for example, on Dec. 9 you'd park on the odd side of the street by 8:00am).

If your street is marked as "No Parking" on one side, a Snow Emergency declaration allows you to park legally in the restricted area during the time the Snow Emergency is in effect. Do not assume that you can move your car when the street is plowed, it must remain parked appropriately until the Snow Emergency is lifted. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated as it ensures Edgewater streets are thoroughly cleared after every storm. Call the Snow Hotline at 779-348-7260 with any questions.

Edgewater contracts with a private company to have all the alleys in the neighborhood plowed. The contractor is called into plow to after 2 inches of snow have fallen. Payment for the contractor comes from Edgewater membership dues and additional donations to the snow plow fund. 

What's the Difference Between a 911 Call Log and Police Statistics?

This example illustrates the difference between the two. If someone calls 911 and needs a Fire/EMS response, it goes into the internal g11 System Dispatch Log as a "Medical Call" to alert our fire department (ambulance) to respond. If the call also requires a police response, like a stabbing, a gunshot or an overdose, then it goes into our internal system as an associated "Medical Assist" to alert the police department to respond to assist the fire department. That information ensures we send the right teams to respond to the crisis.

Information in the 911 Dispatch Log is NOT used in our monthly statistics. The monthly crime statistics are auto-generated based off the formal police reports that are written during and after an incident. The police reports include appropriate coding to identify the actual crime that has occurred. Those same statistics are also reported to the FBI. The FBI has conducted random audits of our police reports and statistics since 2006 and has awarded the police department high marks for accurate reporting.

A look into Edgewater's past...



Getting a glimpse back (WAY back!) in time thanks to a thoughtful neighbor

Edgewater residents living on Clinton Street received a unique gift from some neighbors who had moved out — the abstract book for the neighbor's former house on Clinton Street between Camlin and Ellis, with records dating back to May 1836! Pictured above at left is the cover of the book, including the Rockford Abstract Company logo on top, their RAC stamp at bottom left, and a sketch of the block that includes the property in question.

Pictured above on the right is the first page of entries in the abstract book, detailing the first records of the land tracts that included this property on what is today Clinton Street. Those first entries occurred in the late 1830s, and detailed the land transfers that were made to members of the Nation of Winnebago Indians following a treaty between the tribe and the United States government in 1829. The land that we now know as Edgewater was part of the land transferred to Catherine Myott, member of the Nation of Winnebago Indians, under the authority of President Martin Van Buren. You may recognize the name Myott — there is still a street named Myott in Churchills Grove.

Over time, the original partial land "sections" that were deeded to Catherine Myott were sold, subdivided, platted, and developed. The story of these changes where they relate to this specific property on Clinton Street are all documents in this abstract book. It's a unique artifact with a special story to tell, and we are very fortunate that the Edgewater neighbors who currently possess the book are willing to share it with us all! At our monthly Edgewater Neighborhood Association Meeting in April 2020, these neighbors will bring the book and give a presentation about its contents. We hope you will join us on April 15, 2020, 5:30 p.m. at the Rockford Country Club for what will be a one-of-a-kind opportunity to learn more about this place we call home! Please plan to attend!


Set the stage for Edgewater's Future!

- * Postage for neighborhood mailings and printing of those mailings, as well as signs advertising neighborhood activities.


