### Ash Tree Update



The Public Works Forestry Division began an aggressive removal program of **city-owned** ash trees on June 9, 2014, targeting Ash Trees with 50% or more of their leaf canopy showing signs of distress resulting from the destructive effects of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) disease. The disease has become more widespread and is causing dramatic canopy loss in many of area ash trees.

If the Forestry Division determines that a tree has declined to the point of 50% or more canopy loss, the tree will be marked for removal and city staff will provide notification to the resident or homeowner in the form of a letter left at the residence. Contact information is provided on this notification in the event respective residents have questions. City-owned ash trees are defined as those trees found in the public right-of-way (the area between the public sidewalk and the street) or on cityowned property.

### Walker School: It's OUR Neighborhood

### Hello Edgewater Neighbors,

I am writing with regards to the future of Walker Elementary School, as indicated under the proposals put forth by the Rockford School District's Better Schools initiative. Included in the initiative are three proposals for utilizing the District's resources more effectively. This includes adding additions to some schools, consolidating other schools, and closing still other schools, Walker being one of them. *(continued, next page)* 

After attending two Community Input Sessions, it is clear that the proposals represent a thorough, exhaustive process on behalf of the Facilities Task Force that aims to serve students while leveraging the District's resources better. Towards these aims, each proposal makes clear that the District is not considering the Walker building for use as an elementary school after the 2014-2015 school year. Further, the language used during the Community Input Sessions suggests that a property like Walker will be demolished expediently, in the interest of being 'good neighbors', with no intention to repurpose the property.



The outcome of these proposals in general, and Walker School in particular, will not be determined until the June 24th School Board meeting.

In the meantime, I would like to establish a coalition of neighbors to help determine the best use of the Walker property, if/when it ceases to be used as an Elementary School.

If you would like to play a role in determining the future of the Walker property–and you are willing to commit your time and energy to the process–please contact me. We would likely hold a meeting for the residents within Churchill's Grove, Signal Hill, North End Square, and Edgewater at a later date for the neighbors to come and share their thoughts.
