## "Edgewater Cares" Pollinator Garden Project

Did you know that one of every three spoons of food that you eat requires a pollinator?

#### Did you know that many butterfly and bee populations are declining?

As residents of the Edgewater Neighborhood, my wife Kim and I have adopted a project called **Edgewater Cares**. The purpose of this project is to engage the Edgewater Neighborhood in learning and raising funds to support the restoration of the Pollinator Garden located within Anderson Japanese Gardens. It's on the south bank of the Spring Creek in the Garden of Reflection.

Pollinators are critically important to our ecosystem and this project will help educate guests who tour the Gardens regarding the importance of pollinators and the habitats that sustain them.

We hope this project will help Edgewater families learn about and develop native plantings in their own yards, providing additional, much-needed habitats.

Here are ways to get involved:

#### 1. AT-HOME ART LEARNING AND ART-PROJECT

- Use personal prevention protection methods at all times, whether at home, work, school, community events, or elsewhere:
  - Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds; dry hands with a clean towel or air dry hands
  - Use alcohol-based hand sanitizer when soap and water are unavailable.
  - Cover your mouth with a tissue or sleeve when sneezing or coughing.

## COVID-19 Update from Mayor McNamara

#### Update from Mayor McNamara, shared Friday, March 20:

Friday, I joined leaders from Winnebago County and the Winnebago County Health Department at a news conference to update the community on COVID-19. I amplified Gov. Pritzker's announcement that Illinois residents must now shelter in place beginning at 5 p.m. on Saturday, March 21, through Tuesday, April 7, to help prevent the spread of the disease.

This is a rapidly-evolving public health challenge and I appreciate the dedication of the Winnebago County Health Department. City of Rockford staff and the other agencies working together to address it.

Businesses and services remaining open include supermarkets, pharmacies, banks, gas stations, convenience stores, laundromats, daycare centers for children of health care workers and first responders, auto dealers and service centers, hotels and motels. You can read the entire Executive Order from the Governor HERE.

Medical experts cautioned us several weeks ago that our way of life was going to be altered dramatically. We've been waiting for it, we've been preparing for it and now it's upon us. Please know that the Rockford Police and Fire Departments are prepared and will be maintaining services to residents in our city.

The City's Public Works Department will continue to operate the water utility and respond to infrastructure emergencies, including water main breaks. Other City departments are functioning with staff members working from home when possible.

Please continue to observe best practices from the CDC to prevent exposure and infection:

- · Cover coughs or sneezes.
- Do not touch your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Stay home if you are sick.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Disinfect frequently-touched objects, such as cellphones, laptops, and countertops.

The CDC also notes that patients with COVID-19 have had mild to severe respiratory illness with symptoms of:

- Fever
- Cough
- · Shortness of breath

If you have symptoms, please call your health provider BEFORE visiting a clinic or Emergency Department.

We will make it through this and our community will be better because of our collective actions.



#### How?



Wet your hands with clean, running water (warm or cold), turn off the tap, and apply soap.



Lather your hands by rubbing them together with the soap. Be sure to lather the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your nails.



Scrub your hands for at least 20 seconds. Need a timer? Hum the "Happy Birthday" song from beginning to end twice.



Rinse hands well under clean, running water.



**Dry** hands using a clean towel or air dry them.


#### Rockford Public Schools Compile Resources for Families While Schools Remain Closed



## Seasonal Reminders



#### Yard Refuse Pickup, Street Sweeping

Yard refuse pickup begins the week of March 23rd! Refuse including leaves, grass, and sticks should be placed in brown paper yard waste bags or in garbage cans that are clearly marked with an "X". Branches may be no more than 4 inches in diameter, trimmed to 4 feet in length, and no bundle of branches or yard waste bag/can should weigh more than 50 Reminder: Trash and yard refuse should not be placed in the street but up on the right of way or driveway.



Spring residential street sweeping will begin after arterial streets are completed. The transition is anticipated at the end of April. We'll share more precise dates via Facebook and Nextdoor when they are available and you can also check the City of Rockford Street Division webpage for updates.







## A look into Edgewater's past...



#### Getting a glimpse back (WAY back!) in time thanks to a thoughtful neighbor


Edgewater residents living on Clinton Street received a unique gift from some neighbors who had moved out — the abstract book for the neighbor's former house on Clinton Street between Camlin and Ellis, with records dating back to May 1836! Pictured above at left is the cover of the book, including the Rockford Abstract Company logo on top, their RAC stamp at bottom left, and a sketch of the block that includes the property in question.

Pictured above on the right is the first page of entries in the abstract book, detailing the first records of the land tracts that included this property on what is today Clinton Street. Those first entries occurred in the late 1830s, and detailed the land transfers that were made to members of the Nation of Winnebago Indians following a treaty between the tribe and the United States government in 1829. The land that we now know as Edgewater was part of the land transferred to Catherine Myott, member of the Nation of Winnebago Indians, under the authority of President Martin Van Buren. You may recognize the name Myott — there is still a street named Myott in Churchills Grove.

Over time, the original partial land "sections" that were deeded to Catherine Myott were sold, subdivided, platted, and developed. The story of these changes where they relate to this specific property on Clinton Street are all documents in this abstract book. It's a unique artifact with a special story to tell, and we are very fortunate that the Edgewater neighbors who currently possess the book are willing to share it with us all! At our monthly Edgewater Neighborhood Association Meeting in April 2020, these neighbors will bring the book and give a presentation about its contents. We hope you will join us on April 15, 2020, 5:30 p.m. at the Rockford Country Club for what will be a one-of-a-kind opportunity to learn more about this place we call home! Please plan to attend!
