WELCOME, ROSECRANCE!

Rosecrance Health Network has announced plans to occupy the site of the former Sun View Market at 2704 N. Main St.

Philip Eaton, President/CEO of Rosecrance, said the building is larger than their current Ware Center building in downtown Rockford, offers ample parking for staff and clients, is a single-story structure and is conducive to the kind of landscaping and green space that typify other Rosecrance properties.


Eaton said the move will better serve clients and the community; the site is on a bus line and centrally located for Ware Center clients.

The downtown building is being purchased by Winnebago County, which will give Rosecrance up to a year to move after the sale closes. Renovation at the new Ware Center on North Main Street will cost between \$3 and \$4 million and take up to a year. The site is properly zoned for a medical office.

"We'll be good neighbors," Eaton said. "It will be an attractive building. It will be nicely landscaped. It will be an asset to the community and the neighborhood."

Alice Baird - 225 Harper Avenue

In the autumn of 1958, Mr. & Mrs. Paul Corbridge listed their full brick, two-story home on 225 Harper Avenue for sale at \$28,000. That was more than Mr. & Mrs. Roger Baird and family, who lived in a small bungalow on Quincy & Price, could afford. The following spring, the price of the home was lowered to \$26k. The Bairds made an offer shortly after and nearly 55 years later, Alice Baird is still proud to call 225 Harper Avenue home.

"After World War II, Roger and I both wanted roots right away," Alice shared. Rog, as she calls him, was very anxious to have a permanent home. Mr. Baird has since passed, but Alice keeps both their memories of the home close to her. "My husband just loved living here. It is a solid, wellbuilt home. He would come up from the basement after working on a project, look around, and say, 'I sure like it around here." Alice, now 95 years old, is as spry as ever, keeping a clean home and entertaining guests often.
