Homeowner Responsibilities

Flowers are starting to bloom, leaves are back on trees and the grass is growing. Our neighborhood is one of the most beautiful in Rockford because we all do our part in maintaining our properties. As we get back into the seasonal duties of lawn maintenance, here are some reminders of City ordinances. We also ask that if you live on an alley, please keep trees trimmed and avoid clutter. We need to keep these lanes clear for drivers.

- All properties shall be maintained free from weeds and plant growth in excess of 8 inches.
- All noxious weeds shall be prohibited, this excludes cultivated crops, flowers and gardens.
- Maintain any vegetation growth on the right of way of your property, including parkways, sidewalks and alley ways.
- All yard waste is to be disposed of properly. It is illegal to dump grass clips or leaves into streets or alleys.
- Rock River Disposal picks up yard waste during normal garbage pickup. Yard waste material must be placed in compostable paper bags or in 32 gallon or smaller trash cans that have been marked with a large "X" that is plainly visible from the street.
- Twigs, branches and other types of large brush that cannot fit into either of these containers must be placed in bundles no more than 4 feet long by 2 feet in diameter.


WANT TO THROW A BLOCK PARTY?

QUICK-START TIPS:

Having a Block Party is one of the most encouraging and exciting things you can do for your neighbors! A wonderful opportunity to meet, share a meal, play games, and catch up! And, if you're willing to put in a couple of hours, it's really not that hard to plan. Here are a few tips to hosting one in our neighborhood.

- 1. Plan at least 2 months ahead of time. Once you pick a date (Sundays seem to be free days for most people), you will need to fill out and put together an application to submit to the city.
- 2. The application needs to be SUBMITTED 4 weeks prior to the event date, but you need a number of things completed for the application, which might take about 2 weeks:
 - a. Look at all the rules to follow on the application. See application link below.
 - b. You need SIGNED APPROVAL from 90% of the residents on the block you will need to go door-to-door to get signature from your neighbors. This is a great way to get them excited and involved in helping you plan! However, this is one of the more time-consuming aspects, as you may need to spread this over several days to catch people at home (allow a week or two to accomplish this).
 - c. Create a map showing where you plan to put the blockades (which cross-streets) and showing a 15foot section of the street (the length of the street) where firetrucks will be able to drive if necessary – where there will not be things/tables/tents set-up in the way.
 - d. Host WILL be responsible for the event and anything that happens there. Party must end by 10pm.
 - e. There is a \$35 fee for the application, which must be submitted to the public works department (address in the application), or to CORspecialevents@rockfordil.gov.
 - f. You will need the Alderman's signature on the completed application. Our Alderman is Gina Meeks. You can contact her at gina.meeks@rockfordil.gov
- 3. You will need to set up and take down the street barricades yourself the city only drops them off (they drop the bases in your yard, the barricades at the street intersections).
- 4. Have a great event!



WHY MEMBERSHIP IS IMPORTANT



The Edgewater Neighborhood Association was established in 1979 to create a greater sense of community and provide resources that help keep Edgewater a beautiful, safe, and inviting place to live. Currently, 172 households have paid the \$25 membership fee for 2023. **2023 GOAL - 250 Households as Members.** See the membership form below or go online at rockfordedgewater.org.

Your annual membership fee supports:

- Seasonal Neighborhood Activities including the Easter Egg Hunt, Annual Garage Sale, 4th of July Festivities in Oxford Park, Luminaria and the holiday party.
- Snow Plow Fund: The City does not plow Edgewater's alleys, so we pool our resources and contract with UniTrim Cement to keep the alleys clear. Due to inflation and rising fuel costs, our fees are up an average of 7%. We spend \$410-\$585 per snowfall depending snowfall amounts.
- Plantings at the signs and pots on the bridge.
- Postage and printing for neighborhood mailings as well as signs advertising neighborhood activities.
