# Edgewater Neighborhood: Remembering the past, celebrating the present, anticipating the future!

Edgewater Neighborhood is on the cusp of two significant anniversaries. In 2019, we will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the establishment of the Edgewater Neighborhood Association. Since 1979, the association has provided opportunities for fun, recreation, and celebration in our neighborhood, in addition to investing in beautification projects and providing coordination of such services as alleyway plowing. These efforts are solely supported by households who choose to join each year as members.

Additionally, in 2020 Edgewater will celebrate the 130th anniversary of the year that Edward H. Marsh purchased and platted this land along the west bank of the Rock River and first titled us "Edgewater". Isn't it amazing that Edgewater has been a beautiful, established neighborhood since 1890?

Much has changed since 1890 and even since 1979, but Edgewater remains a stable, thriving neighborhood. While we celebrate these milestones, we also recognize that there is work to be done to make Edgewater even better, and to ensure that it will remain a neighborhood that 1200 households can be proud to call HOME for decades to come! This September 19, we have an opportunity to bring this goal closer to reality!

September 19, volunteers with the Great Neighborhoods Project will facilitate an asset mapping session with Edgewater neighbors. Great Neighborhoods Project is a wholly volunteer-led, grassroots effort to provide resources and support to neighborhood groups to strengthen their neighborhoods and connect them to resources to enhance those efforts. Asset Mapping is a process by which neighbors consider all the various "assets" in their neighborhood (physical, natural, relationships, etc.) and how these great things can be enhanced or better utilized. Over a dozen neighborhoods have already had visits from Great Neighborhoods and awesome things are being accomplished! 
# December 1: Edgewater Luminary Sale & Membership Drive

Here are the details:


- Rock River Adventures will provide a limited number of kayaks and canoes for volunteers.

# Street Sweeping, Yard Refuse Pickup, Hydrant Flushing

City-wide street sweeping will commence September 17, and the map displaying dates when each "zone" will be swept will be published very soon on the City's website.

It is illegal to blow, rake, or sweep yard refuse into the street. This is not only unsightly but also clogs gutters, storm drains, and puts unnecessary debris into our water system.

Yard refuse pickup continues through the fall, and occurs on the same day your trash is picked up. Refuse including leaves, grass, and sticks should be placed in compostable brown paper yard waste bags or in garbage cans that are clearly marked with an "X" on all sides. Branches may be no more than 4 inches in diameter, should be trimmed to 4 feet in length, no bundle of branches or yard waste bag or can should weigh more than 50 pounds. **Reminder:** Bagged trash and yard refuse should not be placed in the street for pickup but up on the right of way or driveway so street sweepers can get closer to the curb. Sweeping crews do not come back to sweep an area that was missed because of improperly placed garbage receptacles or parked cars.

This fall, Edgewater will get "spot-flushing" only for the hydrants that need flushing, as determined by the water division, and as such no definitive schedule can be provided.

# Storm Drains

Street sweepers will help clear debris from our streets, but you can help ensure our water system remains efficient and free from excessive yard waste and trash by taking an extra look at any storm drains in the street along your property. With Fall rains, even partially blocked storm drains can



cause major flooding problems. While you're out doing that Fall yard cleanup take a moment to clear a storm drain!

# Private Property Tree Removal Loan Program

The City of Rockford has launched a program to help address dead and dying trees on private property. The program provides a no-interest loan, to be repaid on the resident's water bill, for the removal of trees deemed a hazard by the City's Forestry Division. The program is available for residents with an annual income under \$70,000, and only for owner-occupied property. Program documents can be found online; contact the City's Customer Service Center at 779-348-7300 with any questions.

# Updates from Code Enforcement & Neighborhood Standards Division

The City of Rockford Code Enforcement Division would like to inform all residents and property owners to be aware of these property maintenance issues within the community:

#### Vehicles - Parking/Storage \*\$50 citation\*

- ☐ Total number of motor vehicles shall be limited to four (4) for each dwelling unit.
- ☐ All motor vehicles shall be operable and have current license plates displayed. Failure to correct this violation may result in the City's removal of the vehicle from the property.
- ☐ Autos, motorcycles, vans and trucks with passenger car or "B" plates must be parked on a paved surface in side and rear yards and must be parked in a driveway in front yards.
- ☐ Motor homes, campers, travel trailers and boats up to 30 ft in length, must be stored in side or rear yards on a paved surface. No motor home, camper, or travel trailer may be stored in any area located between the front property line and the street facing wall of the residential building (Side yard storage must be a minimum of 6 ft from the property line). All other trailers are prohibited. (Example: Utility Trailers, Box Type Trailers, Commercial Trailers, Car Trailers, etc.)

#### **Electronic Products, Tires & Household Hazardous Waste**

- □ Rockford residents may drop off TVs, computer monitors, and other electronics that are to be recycled at Keep Northern Illinois Beautiful's Rockford Recycling Center, located at 4665 Hydraulic Road in Rockford from 2 pm to 5 pm on Tuesdays and 9 am to noon on Saturdays.
- ☐ Small electronics (less than 2'x 2' and no TVs or computer monitors) may be placed in blue 32 gallon recycling cans
- ☐ Household Hazardous Wastes and up to 4 used tires may be dropped off at 3333 Kishwaukee St. on Saturdays from 8 am to 4 pm and Sundays from 12 pm to 4 pm.


